

Policy 316

Graduation Requirements

Effective: July 1, 2001

Revised: March 2007; April 2006; June 9, 2023

1.0 Purpose

This policy defines the public school graduation requirements in the province of New Brunswick.

2.0 Application

This policy applies to the granting of a New Brunswick high school diploma. The requirements differ between the anglophone and francophone sectors.

3.0 Definitions

None.

4.0 Legal Considerations and Authority

Education Act

26 A New Brunswick high school diploma shall be granted to pupils enrolled in the public education program provided under this Act who successfully complete a program of studies by the Minister.

5.0 Goals/Principles

- 5.1 The Department of Education provides a public school system that operates in the best interests of all children and desires to have each student develop the attributes needed to be a lifelong learner, to achieve personal fulfillment and to contribute to a just, democratic productive society.
- **5.2** The Department of Education places a strong emphasis on providing a balanced curriculum.
- **5.3** Differing requirements between the linguistic sectors permit the recognition of the cultural duality of the province.

6.0 Requirements/Standards

- or Grade 12 as of September 2023. Both linguistic sectors have four-year high school programs. In anglophone districts, the successful completion of grades 9 and 10 precedes the acquisition of credits toward graduation requirements, which are fulfilled in grades 11 and 12. In francophone districts, the successful completion of Grade 9 precedes the acquisition of credits toward graduation requirements, which are fulfilled in grades 10, 11 and 12. The graduation requirements which shall be met for the anglophone sector are attached Appendix A. The graduation requirements for the francophone sector can be found in Appendix A of the French version of this policy.
- **6.2** Graduation requirements found in <u>Appendix B</u> are applicable to students entering Grade 9 or Grade 10 as of September 2023. Students in anglophone districts can begin to accumulate credit hours in courses once they have met the learning requirements prescribed for the Grade 9 curriculum in the corresponding subject area or equivalent. Students will be able to graduate when the graduation requirements are met. Appendix B does not apply to students in the francophone sector.

8.0 District Education Council (DEC) Policy Making

District Education Councils have no policy-making authority regarding high school graduation requirements.
