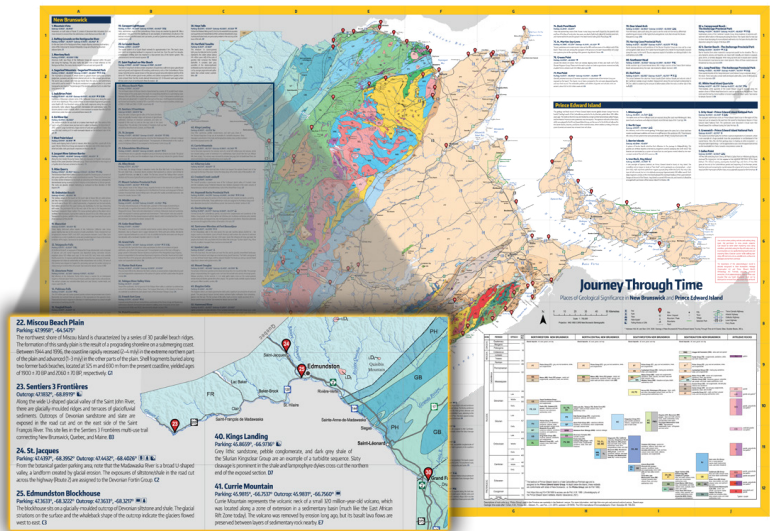


Journey Through Time: Places of Geological Significance in New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island

This detailed, full-colour, double-sided folding map is a great resource for those looking to learn more about the geology of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. While guiding visitors to sites of geological interest, this map also describes how the geological history of these provinces is responsible for spectacular landscapes and natural resources.

From fractured igneous rocks at Sugarloaf Mountain, lithic sandstone at Kings Landing, and massive sea stacks at Hopewell Rocks, to the coastal geology of North Cape and the impressive parabolic dune system at Greenwich, visitors can explore 83 geological highlights of New Brunswick and 7 of Prince Edward Island.



Each site is accompanied by a short description with parking and outcrop coordinates. Information panels describing the geological history, mineral and hydrocarbon resources, fossils, geology of various parks, and coastal zone issues pertaining to climate change are included on the reverse.

Preparation of this map was a collaborative effort between the New Brunswick Geological Survey (Department of Natural Resources and Energy Development), Atlantic Geoscience Society, New Brunswick Museum, and Stonehammer Geopark.
